# CasparFest Saturday and Sunday August 13 and 14

Minutes after the kitchen is completed, the Caspar Cooking crew will be in there getting ready to serve great food. Over the weekend of August 13 and 14, our NINTH annual celebration of community and self-sufficiency will have Caspar's heart throbbing.

Market applications, and the latest information about CasparFest, can be found at the Festival's website, CasparFest.org.

Music this year will include Joe Craven, Ishi Dube, Alice DiMicele and her trio, Hawaii's slack key master Kevin Brown, Hui Arago, Marcus McCallen and John Bush, and Redbud, a reggae and ska band from Ukiah—plus many more. A full two days of musical entertainment will be on hand.

Sustainable Community will be the topic of a number of workshops, including Matt Samuelson and Linus Kasminus on pickling local crafted foods, Oscar Stedman on making pasta, Bette Goldfarb on drying vegetables and fruits, and Dan Stalzer on making tempeh. Speakers will include Jim Tarbell on Solidarity Economy: moving from extraction to restoration; Charles Cresson Woods on creating a local currency; and Julia Frech on How Time Bank/Time Sharing works in the Ukiah Valley and might work on the coast. Kids' activities will include a puppet show presented by Corinne and Radek Tuma Saturday and Sunday mornings at 11, Deconstruction Fun (take stuff apart and make a sculpture) with Obe Brown, ribbon wands, bubble wands and hula hoops with U'i Wesley, games of chance, 4H Petting Zoo and baby goats, the Gorse Monster Parade, and, of course, amazing face painting by Pamella and Hattie Craven, Vivien Fontanilla, Meghana Kao, and U'i Wesley.

The dinner will start at 7 sharp with a champagne toast and will be served family style, with dishes to please vegetarian and carnivore palates.
