Canning Workshops with Marty Johnson

Sundays: May 15th, June 5th, July 3rd, August 14th, September 11th, and October 2nd Each workshop is scheduled to start at 10 and go until 2 altho the starting time may change to 10:30 because I will be milking six goats this year and I don't know how long that will take.

Speaking of birthing goats, it seems because all the goats got bred within the same time frame, that they may all be birthing the same two or three days (April 8, 9, and 10). If any of you would like to help, I would love the support. It can be two hours. Tasks usually involve: if there are three babies helping wipe off one baby as mother licks off the other two, holding newborns, helping me as I teach them to nurse, weighing new babies, and cleaning and putting in new straw. It would be nice to have two or three other adults off and on during the three days to help. If you are interested let me know and I will contact you as we get closer to the birthing time. I have never had help before but this is a lot of births close together.



Two new books that I have been reading in anticipation of this year's workshops are Nancy Singleton-Hachisu's Preserving the Japanese Way and Eugenia Bone's The Kitchen Ecosystem. Nancy's book is a wonderful read about the traditions of preserving food in Japan and hopefully I will try to make miso. We have done recipes from Eugenia's first preserving book Well Preserved but this second book is a wonderful expansion of her notion of preserving and using ingredients. She organizes the book around individual vegetable, fruits, and meats with recipes for the fresh produce, preserving suggestion for produce and then recipes for how to use what you have preserved. It extends the idea of preserving small batches while you are using the ingredient in a recipes. Wonderful ideas for this coming year.

Hope you are all enjoying the rain and look forward to gathering again in May.

Sand Mandala March 22nd – March 24th at Caspar Community Center

The Sacred Arts of Tibet World Tour will be visiting Caspar and constructing a sand mandala at the Caspar Community Center. Everyone is invited to come and support the monks and the people of Tibet. The mandala will begin around 9 AM on Tuesday the 22nd and end in a ritual dissolution of the mandala on Thursday the 24th beginning at noon.

Purpose of the Tour

The purpose of the Sacred Arts of Tibet tour is to share with all people the monks' Tibetan culture, as well as practices and paths to inner peace and compassion. Accomplishments of previous tours have provided funds for construction of new buildings at Gaden Shartse including the new debate hall. Additional funds raised by past tours have supported medical needs, teachers'

salaries and the day to day expenses of the monastery. This success is due to the help and generosity of those who support the tours. The monks of Gaden Shartse feel deeply indebted to their friends in the West who have given their time, effort, and homes to make the tours possible. It is hoped that the upcoming tour will be a success.

Community Support

The monks will be staying at Jughandle Farm in Caspar and be involved in other local projects while they are visiting. They will visit Mendocino High School, Gualala Arts Center Thursday evening from 7 PM to 9 PM for a healing ceremony, Buddhist meditation groups and will also be conducting healings and blessings in the surrounding area.
