

During my first year as a Caspar resident and new board member I've gotten to know the Caspar Community Board Members and to appreciate the different ways they bring their deep care for this place and the people who live and visit here to life. I hope to continue in this work of generosity with all of you in the coming years!

What is next? When board members look into the future for Caspar Community a few dream projects are coming into view, with you right by our sides.

- We are re-committed to gathering together. Quarterly community meetings and meet-your-neighbor pot lucks will be on the calendar. Fourth Sunday Breakfast and the new Game Night catch both morning people and night owls for a time to catch up and enjoy good food.
- Indoors our dancers report that time to update the floors in the North and South Room is coming: a project that will necessitate closing the Center's doors for weeks at the earliest in 2024.
- A longtime vision for a patio (more dancing!) and an outdoor kitchen is starting to come together. Research began this summer and all that's learned will be shared at a community meeting this year.
- And keeping the roof over our heads in good health, the north roof face could use some clean up.


Thank you, friends and neighbors. Be healthy and I hope to see you over a bowl of soup, cup of tea, or across the mailboxes soon.



Once again, the costs of operating our Center has outrun our income. This year, the shortfall is 32% of income, or about \$22,000.

But look how prudently the Center navigated the setbacks of the last two years: we're coming back strong! Our employees cut their wages by 42% in 2020, and another 7% in 2021. The facilities committee reduced upkeep expenses by 50% and 38%; only this year have we been able to pick up necessary deferred maintenance (but we're still down \$10k from 'normal' operations in 2019.)





Our Community Center has been called "a Coastal Treasure" and "a model of excellent nonprofit management." Please help us keep the Center alive by donating generously before the end of 2022.
